

## Sea & Sage Audubon SJWS Census Report for December 2011

**Comments:** It was a beautiful morning — it was very clear, the water was still, there was no wind, and, it was chilly until the sun rose higher. Many of the birds were just standing in the water motionless which greatly helped with the counting. The lighting on the birds was superb, making the iridescent green on the heads of the ducks glow in the morning light. As the sun rose higher, the Song Sparrows began to sing around the ponds, followed by an occasional burst of song from a White-crowned Sparrow. Though the Harris's Hawk didn't make an appearance during our morning census, Terry, Barbara and Betsy did see the striking male Vermilion Flycatcher by pond 1. A Wilson's Phalarope swimming in pond D was spotted by Nancy & Carol; it was there for only a short appearance and then it disappeared. In the Back 40 area, Darrell & Jerry spotted a very unusual bird for the SJWS — a Swamp Sparrow! All in all, it was quite a morning!
